Shot Clinic

Monday (9/29) to Wednesday (10/1) 9:30am – 11:00am, 2:00am – 4:00pm Student Health Center (across from Colleges 9/10) Appointment needed – call (831) 459-2500 to schedule. Students in college live in large groups and are at risk for communicable diseases. The American College Health

Association strongly recommends that students are fully immunized. Receive immunizations or have your immunization records reviewed for the following: Hepatitis B (\$121 each - series of 3 required), meningitis (\$146), MMR (\$87), tetanus/pertussis (Tdap) (\$77), HPV (Gardasil) (\$150 each - series of 3 required), Varicella (Chicken Pox) (\$128), and Influenza (Flu) (\$25). All of the mentioned vaccines are 100% covered by the UC health insurance plan. ONLY proof of Hepatitis B vaccination for students younger than 19 years of age on 9/21/13 is required for enrollment. The other vaccinations are highly recommended by the CDC and the American College Health Association. To take full advantage of this clinic, please have your immunization records w/you.
