You can pay or print a fee waiver at <u>https://www.awpe.org</u>. (International students take the exam on September 19 during Global Start program.)

• MANDATORY FALL FROSH ACADEMIC ORIENTATION: Monday, September 25th at 11:00 am, Stevenson Event Center. Attend this session to learn all the information you need to start your college career led by the Stevenson College Advisers.

• **CORE COURSE:** As a new Stevenson student, you will participate in an important Stevenson tradition by taking "Self and Society," our two-quarter Core Course. This course is designed to help you develop your skills in analytical thinking and university-level writing which will prepare you for advanced study at UCSC. Please bring your assignment to your first Core Course section meeting. (International students may take core course beginning Fall 18 depending on your Analytical Writing Placement Exam score.)

• NEW STUDENT MATERIALS AND WELCOME WEEK SCHEDULE: If you are living on-campus, you will pick up your student ID and new student housing materials when you check in for move-in. If you are living off-campus, you may pick up your student ID at the Stevenson College Housing Office. You can find the Welcome Week Schedule in the *UCSC Colleges* app; see attached instructions. If you are not able to download the app, you can use the web version online (https://bit.ly/stguide) or pick up a hard copy of the Welcome Week schedule in the Stevenson College Office. (Please note: information may be subject to change). The Stevenson College Guide in the UCSC Colleges app has information on many required and important events taking place throughout the week, as well as other helpful resources.

#### **Important Things To Do Before Fall Quarter Begins**

Stevenson College, UCSC

- □ If you have not enrolled in three classes, do it now! Don't count on being able to get into classes by "crashing" classes after they begin or by assuming you will get a space from a wait list. Enroll in back up classes instead of counting on a wait list spot.
- □ If you have not yet enrolled, please refer to the UCSC Fall Enrollment Information email you received from Stevenson College on June 24th for guidance about choosing and enrolling in classes. If you have questions, contact either your Major/Program Adviser (if your questions are concerning major requirements or prerequisites) or a Stevenson College Adviser (if your questions are concerning general education, college, or other requirements).
- □ **Complete the summer core course assignment**. When you arrive at Stevenson in September, you will need to bring your completed assignment to the first core course meeting. (The assignment can be found at <u>http://stevenson.ucsc.edu/advising/new-student-enrollment-info.html</u> in the Core Course Enrollment Guide and Information.)
- □ Verify that all of your final official transcripts and test scores have been received by the Office of Admissions. You can do this by checking your "To Do" list on the Student Center page of your student portal (My.UCSC.edu) or by calling 831-459-2131. Contact the Admissions Office <u>immediately</u> if you did not meet the conditions of your admission.
- □ **Pay your registration and housing fees before the deadline**. Bills were posted to your student portal on August 29th and registration and housing fees must be <u>received</u> (not postmarked) at UCSC by 4:00 p.m. on September 21, 2017. Mail your fees early if possible; allow adequate time for the campus to receive your payment. For more information, see <u>http://sbs.ucsc.edu</u>
- Registration fees include an Undergraduate Health Insurance Fee. You must either pay the fee or request a waiver by submitting proof of comparable health insurance to the Student Health Center by September 1, 2017. For more information, contact the <u>Student Health</u> Insurance Office at (831) 459-2389 or via email at insure@ucsc.edu.
- □ **Submit proof of Immunization Requirements.** All incoming students are required to meet the UC Immunization and Tuberculosis risk screening compliance. For more information, see <a href="https://healthcenter.ucsc.edu/information/uc\_vaccines.html">https://https//h
- □ If you are a financial aid recipient, be sure you have submitted all necessary documentation to the Financial Aid Office. If you are not sure what their office needs from you, check your "To Do" list on the Student Center page of your student portal (My.UCSC.edu).
- ❑ Activate your free UCSC email account. Information about UCSC email accounts is available on the ITS (Information Technology Services) website: <u>http://its.ucsc.edu/email/index.html</u>. Most UCSC offices communicate with students through email – it is important that you not only activate your account, you must check and respond to email messages regularly.
