Hi, my name is Sean and I wanted to say a few things about why core is important as it is and how changing it would be a mistake.

First, I want to give an example why keeping core a writing class is essential. I did not understand Sartre when we read him and thought the entire class was going to be a waste of time, but then when we had to write about him, I started putting his ideas into words I personally understood and realized that I really did understand Sartre and his ideas have changed my life since.

Second, I think keeping the classes smaller is good way to keep everyone involved and making it very hard to disengage from the class conversation. It also gives the professors time to really put helpful input on the student's papers instead of just giving a grade.

Lastly, the combination of reading, writing, and meaningful feedback in one class has grown my general knowledge and awareness of the world around me more than any of these things could do by themselves.

I hope you will help me in making the administration reconsider their mistake.
